- **Become zero waste**: Slowly try to reduce your waste a bit every week. Consider giving a home-made gift instead of buying a present at Easter.
- Invite wildlife into our garden or church green space (with permission): this spring allow parts of the garden to grow wild. Invite others in the community to be part of the journey-maybe encouraging children to plant seeds or help build and stock a hedgehog home.

An Easter Message from Revd. Tim Broughton

I wonder if you feel, sometimes, that Easter Sunday was such a long time ago, how can it possibly have any relevance to us, here in Settle Circuit, in the 21st Century. At the heart of the story is the life and death of a truly remarkable man, the likes of which we have never seen before or since. But surrounding him, everywhere you look, are ordinary folk – people like us.

There is Mary, a woman grieving. The one she looked to, trusted in, in whom her hopes for the future were tied up, is taken from her. She is saddened and grieving as she goes to the tomb on that Sunday morning, her beloved Jesus lost.

The disciples are fearful, wondering about their uncertain future. Suddenly, it seems, their world has fallen apart. They marched into Jerusalem just a few days before with such hopes, such expectations and now their dreams have been dismantled. They are hiding for fear of the consequences of even being associated with Jesus, worried about news and gossip.

Thomas is a man who needs certainty. He's heard rumours, talk of something that's happened, but he can't bring himself to believe it. The hope is too much, what if he is disappointed again? Better to not believe, than to commit his heart again and be disappointed.

Peter is a disciple whose deep sense of guilt made him feel that he could never be received again by Jesus. He'd followed him for three years, committed his all and his future to him, even confessed him to be the Messiah, the son of God. Now his denials weighed heavy on his mind and his heart. He wondered if he could ever return.

Perhaps we find ourselves, this Easter season, in need of comfort in a time of grief, hope in a time of uncertainty or faith in a time of doubt or with a sense of guilt for things we wish we had done or said. Seasons of faith match the seasons of our soul, but the Easter story tells us that there is one, one remarkable man, in whom we can trust, can believe, can hope, one who doesn't turn us away because of our past.

This year, as every year since that remarkable Sunday morning, 2,000 years ago, our churches will tell and retell this story of doubt and faith, of despair and hope, of death and resurrection. We share it and retell it because it is our story. Perhaps it is your story too?
