We all know that our cars need fossil fuels to keep them going (unless you have already gone electric, of course), but we can do our best to minimise the impact on our dwindling supplies. Have a look at these Eco driving tips.

1. In the car drive away immediately when starting from cold - idling to heat the engine wastes fuel and causes rapid engine wear.
2. When driving, the most efficient speed depends on the car in question but is typically around 55-65 mph; faster speeds will greatly increase your fuel consumption. Slow down and allow a little more time for journeys.
3. In the car switch off your engine if you pull over or are in stationary traffic - even if just for a minute. It saves you fuel, reduces the nitrous oxide pollution, both for you and those around you, and cuts noise pollution.

One more thing.....

There are many more cyclists and walkers around our roads at this time of year. Let's be considerate to them by giving them extra space, especially when overtaking.
