Safeguarding

Basic safeguarding training is getting a national update. This means everyone who needs basic training is now due a renewal in the new year.

Bird Boxes

Now is a great time to get bird boxes up because it's when many of our resident birds begin the process of looking for nest sites for next year. Some birds will use them to roost in winter. Here are some top tips:



- If you have the common bird box with a small hole at the front (ie, for blue tits, great tits or sparrows) place them on a house wall facing between north and east. This avoids glaring sunlight which they don't like. Don't just go for one box; 2, 3 or 4 will give you more chance of occupation next spring and you may even develop a colony! Don't place them too close together as this might promote aggression between noisy neighbours.
- Avoid placing boxes immediately next to busy footpaths or roads and if you have pets, hide boxes away from areas they frequently use. Often, chapel buildings are excellent sites for bird boxes. Have a word with your property steward!
- Make sure there are branches nearby that the bird can land on before going into the box. This will save energy when feeding young birds and when teaching the young to fly.
- Boxes should be placed high enough, 3 metres is good, to reduce the risk of predators accessing the box.
- Sit back and enjoy fingers crossed!

Recycling at St John's (ECO Group)

Just a reminder that there is a recycling station at St John's in Settle.

We recycle jewellery for the Alzheimer's Society, stamps for charities (currently RNIB), printer ink cartridges and batteries for Settle Hub.



Do remember to bring in any of these items when visiting St John's. Obviously, other churches may have their own recycling initiatives.

Sadly, we no longer recycle blister packs although ACE is able to offer this facility for those attending their monthly sessions at St John's.
