Churches across all denominations in England and Wales can now register to participate in <u>Churches</u> <u>Count on Nature</u>, an annual scheme where people visit churchyards and record the plant and animal species they encounter.

The biodiversity survey, supported by environmental charities A Rocha UK and Caring for God's Acre, as well as The Church of England and The Church in Wales, will take place from 7-15 June 2025.
